

Terms of Reference

WWR Competitions Working Group

The Competitions Working Group (CWG) provides advice and consultation on issues related to international competitions in wheelchair rugby.

The CWG shall be composed of up to eight (8) members:

- Lead and chair - Appointed by the WWR CEO or WWR Board
- Zone 1 representative - Resides within the WWR Americas Zone
- Zone 2 representative - Resides within the IWRP European Zone
- Zone 3 representative - Resides within the Asia-Oceania Zone
- Athlete representative - Nominated by the IWRP Athletes Council
- Member at large - Nominated by the CWG Lead
- Member at large - Nominated by the CWG Lead

- *The current World Championship and Paralympic Technical Delegates may also form part of the CWG

All member nominations shall be confirmed by the WWR CEO or WWR Board.

The CWG shall be responsible to develop and implement policies and procedures and to make recommendations to the WWR Board of Directors and General Assembly on matters relating to international competitions in wheelchair rugby, including:

- Maintain and update the WWR Competition Regulations
- Maintain and update the WWR World Ranking List
- Licensing of international competitions
- Regional and Global competition communications as required
- Qualification process for WWR championship events and Paralympic Games
- Bidding, site selection, and hosting of WWR championship events producing documentation, sending documentation and associated follow up
- Selection of Technical Delegates for WWR licensed events
- Develop and assist Technical Delegates
- Any other requests that relate to the general running of WWR competitions.

The Competitions Working Group will meet between four (4) to eight (8) times per year. When finances permit, at least one meeting may be held in person. The CWG may at its discretion establish sub-committees to examine specific issues within its mandate.
