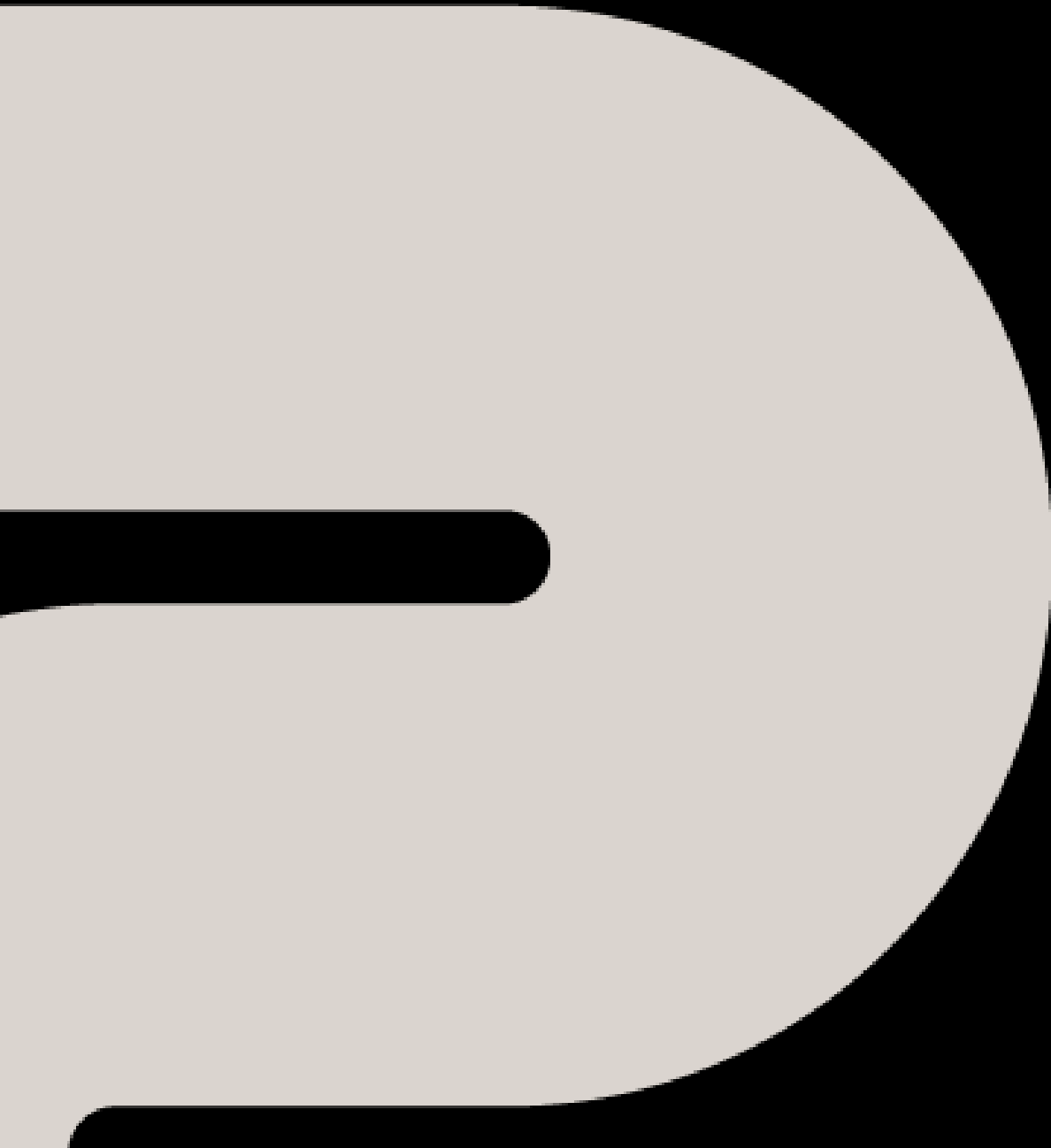

This table details amendments to the Game Commissioner manual for the sport of wheelchair rugby. The table shows text from specific sections in the manual, with changes highlighted. The full sections are not included, only the paragraphs containing changes.

Updates to the Decision Review Regulation Process

The Competitions Committee and Technical Committee have been working to remove the Decision Review Regulation from Competition Regulations and incorporating it into the Correctible Error process (Article 42) within the rules. The motivation behind incorporating a decision review into the correctible error rule was to streamline the process, as the basis of the correctible error and a decision review are similar.

The update will also allow for decisions made within the game to be corrected by the officials within that game, i.e., removal of the requirement for external consultation from the process.
