Is this correct?	On the opening tip-off, the ball is tapped out of bounds. The referee declares the tip-off void as it can't be determined which player tipped the ball out of bounds. The referee restarts the tip-off, and the game clock is reset to 8:00. Is this correct?
8.67.3	Dribbling the Ball	Answer: Yes. If the referees conclude that A2 definitively dribbled the ball within 10 seconds, the call is considered an inadvertent whistle. Team A should retain possession and the forty second clock is reset.	Answer: Yes. The situation is managed as a correctable error as it is decided that A1 did dribble the ball.
8.69.7	Throw-in	Player A1 indicates that he is the in- bounder. Instead of progressing directly to the inbound position, A1 delays to allow his team to get into position. The referee blows his whistle and places the ball on the ground to begin the 10 second count. Is this correct?	Player A1 indicates that he is the in- bounder. Instead of progressing directly to the inbound position, A1 delays to allow his team to get into position or attempts to block a defensive player on the court. The referee blows his whistle and warns the Team A about delaying the game. A1 is still required to inbound the ball. If the situation occurs again in the game, a technical foul will be called for delay of game. Is this correct?
8.70.9 New Case	Substitutions		Substitutions from the substitution area may enter the court from any part of the substitution area (front or side) and at any location on the team bench area. Is this correct? Answer: Yes. Players are not limited to entering from the substitution area only.
