

Coaching Working Group and Education Curriculum Advisory Group

Do you have what it takes to motivate, enthuse and generally bring out the best in people? If so, we would love to hear from you.

WWR are looking for specialised individuals that use their interpersonal skills and experience to be "Learning Champions". Helping coaches be more productive and achieve great results.

The WWR Heads of Departments have recently been working with the World Academy of Sport (WAoS) and World Rugby to review our previous coach education pathway and to evolve this to a new framework. The next phase of development is for WAoS and WWR to create an updated coach education package that suits the requirements of our stakeholders. The plan is for the new WWR coach education package to be made available through an online learning management system (Censeo) developed specific to the needs of the international sports sectors.

Once the new pathway has been finalised and rolled out, learners will be able to complete a new online Wheelchair Rugby Ready Course as the WWR Introduction to Wheelchair Rugby (Level 1) Qualification and then attend face-to-face workshops to gain a WWR Coach of Beginner / Intermediate Players (Level 2) Qualification.

There will also be a Coach Educator certification course to ensure we progressively develop a global footprint of Educators for the long-term development of our sport. This will enable qualified and recognised WWR Coach Educators to deliver coaching courses and to certify candidate Wheelchair Rugby coaches.

To help ensure the updated package is fit for purpose we are looking to recruit a diverse group of experienced people to contribute to and feedback on the development of the content that WWR are working on.

One role of the Coaching Working Group is to act as the Curriculum Advisory Group and would comprise a mixture of wheelchair rugby coaches with a diverse background of knowledge and experience within the sport as well as individuals with experience and expertise within education.

The Group will aim to meet on a regular basis to discuss progress of the coach education pathway and to provide feedback and advice on the resources and assets which are intended to be used following the redevelopment.
